Shri Ankit Mohata was appointed as an Additional Director by the Board of Director w.e.f.30-05-2017 in accordance with the provisions of Section 161 of the Companies Act, 2013. Pursuant to Section 152 of the Companies Act, 2013 the above director holds office up to the date of the ensuing Annual General Meeting. In his regard the company has received request in writing from a member of the company proposing his candidature for appointment as Director of the company in accordance with the provisions of Section 160 and all other applicable provisions of the Companies Act, 2013. The Board feels that presence of Shri Ankit Mohata on the Board is desirable and would be beneficial to the company.

Your directors recommend the resolution set out in item no.3 of the accompanying Notice. None of the Directors, except Shri Ankit Mohata, in any way, concerned or interested financially or otherwise, in the Resolution.

OPERATIONS:

During the year under review, the Company has recorded Net losses of Rs.17,13,791/- for the year as compared to loss of Rs. 2,37,972/- in the previous year.

CAPITAL AND RESERVES:

A) <u>Capital</u>:

As per the Compliance of requirement set out by RBI in Circular RBI/2014-15/299-DNBR(PD) CC.No.002/03/03.10.001/2014-15 dated November 10,2014, minimum Net Owned Funds (NOF) requirement for all NBFCs of Rs.200 lacs by the end of March 2017. So to attain a minimum NOF of Rs.200 lacs, board of Directors of the Company decided to meet the fund requirement by issue of equity shares on preferential basis. Accordingly Extra Ordinary General Meeting was held on 25-03-2017 for taking approval of shareholders for increase in authorized share capital of the company from Rs.25 lacs to Rs.45 lacs and allotment of 165000 equity shares of Rs.10/- each at a premium of Rs.48/- per share on preferential basis.

However till 31st march 2017 company didn't received in principal approval from BSE, hence fail to allot share by the March 31,2017. Company received in principal approval from BSE in April'17 and issued preferential shares to allottees on 24-04-2017. Hence on signing date of financial statement ending March 31, 2017 Authorised share capital of the company is Rs.45 lacs divided into 450000 equity shares of Rs.10/- each and Paid up Capital is Rs.40.50 lacs divided into 405000 equity shares of Rs.10/- each.



B) Reserves:

Total Reserves as on 31-03-2017 stands at Rs.107.57 lacs against Rs.124.71 lacs on 31-03-2016.

DIVIDEND

In view of loss incurred by the company, your directors have not recommended any dividend for the year under review.

DEPOSITS:

Your Company has not accepted any deposits within the meaning of Section 73 of the Companies Act, 2013 and the Companies (Acceptance of Deposits) Rules, 2014.

INTERNAL CONTROL SYSTEMS AND THEIR ADEQUACY:

The Company has an Internal Control System, commensurate with the size, scale and complexity of its operations. The scope and authority of the Internal Audit function is defined in the Internal Audit Manual. To maintain its objectivity and independence, the Internal Audit function reports to the Chairman of the Audit Committee of the Board & to the Chairman of the Company. The Internal Auditor appointed by the Company viz. Shri Rajat Jain, monitors and evaluates the efficacy and adequacy of internal control system in the Company, its compliance with operating systems, accounting procedures and policies at all locations of the Company. The Audit Committee of the Board addresses significant issues raised by both the Internal Auditors and Statutory Auditors.

DIRECTORS:

• Changes in Directors and Key Managerial Personnel:

During the year Shri Ganesh Sharma (DIN: 07489139) who was appointed as an Additional Director on 18-04-2016, was appointed as an Independent Director for a term of 5 years in the Annual General Meeting held on 30-09-2016.

• Statement of Declaration given by Independent Directors :

All Independent Directors have given declarations that they meet the criteria of independence as laid down under Section 149(6) of the Companies Act, 2013 and clause 49 of the Listing Agreement.

• Board Evaluation:

Pursuant to the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 and Clause 49 of the Listing Agreement, the Board has carried out an evaluation of its own performance, the directors individually as well as the evaluation of the working of its Audit, Appointment & Remuneration Committees. The manner in which the evaluation has been carried out has been explained in the Corporate Governance Report.

• Remuneration Policy:

The Board has, on the recommendation of the Appointment & Remuneration Committee, framed a policy for selection and appointment of Directors, Senior Management and their remuneration. The Remuneration Policy is stated in the Corporate Governance Report.

Meetings:

During the year 8 (Eight) Board Meetings, 4 (Four) Audit Committee Meetings, 4 Stake Holders Relationship Committee and 1 (One) Nomination & Remuneration Committee meeting were convened and held, the details of which are given in the Corporate Governance Report. The intervening gap between the Meetings was within the period prescribed under the Companies Act, 2013.

AUDITORS & AUDIT REPORT

The members of the Company had at its Annual General Meeting (AGM) held on September 27, 2014, appointed M/s. Chaturvedi Sohan & Co., Chartered Accountants, (Firm Registration No. 118424W), as the Statutory Auditors of the Company for a period of 5 (five) years, i.e. till the conclusion of 37th AGM, subject to ratification of their appointment by members at every AGM. The Company has received a certificate from the Statutory Auditors to the effect that ratification of their appointment, if made, shall be in compliance with the provisions Section 139 and 141 of the Companies Act, 2013. Accordingly, the Board proposes ratification of their appointment at the ensuing Annual General Meeting.

The Notes of Financial Statements referred to in the Auditor's Report are self-explanatory and do not call for any further comments.

SECRETARIAL AUDIT:

Pursuant to provisions of section 204 of the Companies Act, 2013 and The Companies (Appointment and Remuneration of Managerial Personnel) Rules, 2014 the company has appointed Pankaj & Associates, a firm of company Secretaries in practice to undertake the Secretarial Audit of the Company.

As required under section 204 (1) of the Companies Act, 2013 the Company has obtained a secretarial audit report and the Secretarial Audit report is annexed herewith as "Annexure-II". It has no major observations made by the Auditor in the Report except the following:

- 1. The Company has not appointed Company Secretary till date as required under section 203 of the Companies Act, 2013.
- 2. In terms of Section 161, the additional Director Mr.Ganesh Sharma was confirmed and appointed as Director of the Company in AGM but company filed Form DIR-12 for Change in Designation with Registrar of Companies after due date.
- 3. Rules 20(3)(v) of Companies Rules, 2014 was not complied by the Company which requires to publish the Notice of E-voting in at least one vernacular newspaper in local language and in at least one English Newspaper in English language.
- 4. Rule 10 of Companies Rules, 2014 has not complied by the company which requires every listed company to give advertisement for closure of register of members in at least one English as well as at least one vernacular language newspaper.
- 5. Regulation 47 of SEBI Regulations 2015 not complied by the company which require company to give advertisement in Newspaper for intimation of Board Meeting in which the financial results will be considered and approved along with financial results.

INTERNAL FINANCE CONTROL:

The Company has in place adequate internal financial controls with reference to financial statements. It has established an integrated framework in managing risks and internal controls. The internal financial controls have been documented, digitized and embedded in the business processes. Such controls have been assessed during the year under review and were operating effectively.

PARTICULARS OF ENERGY CONSERVATION:

The Company's operations are not energy intensive and as such involve low energy consumption. However adequate measures have been taken to conserve the consumption of energy.

FOREIGN EXCHANGE EARNINGS AND OUT-GO:

During the period under review there was no foreign exchange earnings or out flow.

HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT AND INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS

Your Company continues to take new initiatives to further align its HR policies to meet the growing needs of its business. People development continues to be a key focus area of the Company. The industrial relations in all the units of the Company remained cordial and peaceful throughout the year.

The Company does not have any subsidiary.

The Company has a vigil mechanism named Fraud and Risk Management Policy to deal with instance of fraud and mismanagement, if any.



Secretarial Audit was conducted in a manner that provided us a reasonable basis for evaluating the corporate conducts/statutory compliances and expressing our opinion thereon.

Based on our verification of the Ganesh Holdings Ltd books, papers, minute books, forms and returns filed and other records maintained by the company and also the information provided by the Company, its officers, agents and authorized representatives during the conduct of secretarial audit, We hereby report that in our opinion, the company has, during the audit period covering the financial year ended on 31st March, 2017 complied with the statutory provisions listed hereunder and also that the Company has proper Board-processes and compliance mechanism in place to the extent, in the manner and subject to the reporting made hereinafter:

We have examined the books, papers, minute books, forms and returns filed and other records maintained by Ganesh Holdings Ltd ("the Company") for the financial year ended on 31st March, 2017 according to the provisions of:

confirmed and appointed as Director of the company in Annual General Meeting but company filed Form DIR- 12 (for change in designation) with Registrar of Companies after due date.

- 3. Rule 20 (3) (v) of Companies (Management and Administration) Rules, 2014 was not complied by the Company which requires the Company to publish the Notice of E-voting in at least one vernacular newspaper in the principal vernacular language of the district in which the registered office of the company is situated and at least once in English language in an English Newspaper having a wide circulation in that district.
- 4. Rule 10 of Companies (Management and Administration) Rules, 2014 was not complied by the Company which requires every listed company to give advertisement for Closure of register of members in at least one vernacular newspaper in the principal vernacular language of the district and having a wide circulation in the place where the registered office of the company is situated, and at least one in English language in an English newspaper circulating in that district and having wide circulation in the place where the registered office of the company is situated.
- 5. Regulation 47 of SEBI(Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 require Company to give advertisement in Newspaper for intimation of Board Meeting in which the financial results will be considered and approved along with the Publication of financial results in newspapers, which was not complied by the Company.

We have relied on the representations made by the Company and its Officers for the system and mechanism framed by the Company for compliances under other Acts, Laws and Regulations applicable to the Company as listed in Annexure II.


We further report that





INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF GANESH HOLDING LIMITED

1. Report on the Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Ganesh Holding Limited ("the Company"), which comprise the Balance Sheet as at 31st March 2017 and the Statement of Profit and Loss and cash flow statement for the year then ended, and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

2. Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

The Company's Board of Directors is responsible for the matters stated in Section 134(5) of the Companies Act, 2013 ("the Act") with respect to the preparation of these financial statements that give a true and fair view of the financial position and financial performance of the Company in accordance with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, including the Accounting Standards specified under section 133 of the Act, read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014. This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding of the asssets of the Company and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the financial statements that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

3. Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these standalone financial statements based on our audit.

We have taken into account the provisions of the Act, the accounting and auditing standards and matters which are required to be included in the audit report under the provisions of the Act and the Rules made thereunder.

We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing specified under_Section 143(10) of the Act. Those Standards require that we comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal financial control relevant to the Company's preparation of the financial statements that give a true and fair view in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances. An audit also includes evaluating the

appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of the accounting estimates made by Company's Directors, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion on the financial statements.

4. Basis of qualified opinion:

- 1) As stated in note no 4 to the statement, the company has bought and sold commodities through broker Anand Rathi commodities ltd who was registered with National Spot Exchange Limited (NSEL). Due to NSEL scam the business had stopped and some stock had remained unsold with broker. As explained to us by the management the committee of NSEL decided to pay whole amount to investor in small amount. Total amount recoverable as on 31th March 2017 is Rs 73,07,951/- as per management the same amount is good and recoverable and proviusion for doubtful debts is not require but the company is need to follow provisioning requirement in line of master circular no RBI /2014 -15/299 DNBR(PD) CC No 002/03.10.001/2014-15. Further in the absence security and further development of case we are unable to comment on recoverability of above amount.
- As per terms of Notification No.DNBS.132/CGM(VSNM)-99 dated April 21, 1999, the minimum NOF requirement for NBFC companies are required to obtain a Certificate of Registration (CoR) from the Bank to commence/carry on business of NBFI in terms of Section 45-IA of the RBI Act, 1934 of Rs. 200 lakh by the end of March 2017.

 As explained to us the Company is in process to make preferential issue of equity share to comply the above patification but till 21st march 2017 company didn't required in principal

comply the above notification, but till 31st march 2017 company didn't received in principal approval from BSE, hence failed to allot share by the March 31,2017.


However in month of April 2017 company receive in principal approval from BSE and has issued equity share in month of April 2017 to comply above requirement.



A company's internal financial control over financial reporting is a process designed to provide reasonable assurance regarding the reliability of financial reporting and the preparation of financial statements for external purposes in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles. Qualified Opinion

- 1) According to the information and explanations given to us and based on our audit, the following material weaknesses have been identified in the Company's internal financial controls over financial reporting as at March 31, 2017:
 - a) The Company did not have appropriate internal control system in respect of valauation and provisioning of loan and advances (please refer point 1 of basis of qualification para of Independent audit report)
 - b) The Company did not have appropriate internal control system in respect of circular and notification of RBI related NBFC compliances. (please refer point no 2 of basis of qualification para of ladependent audit report)

Notes to Financial Statements for the year ended 31st March, 2017

1. Significant Accounting Policies

1.1 Basis of preparation

The financial statements of the company have been prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles in India (Indian GAAP). The company has prepared these financial statements to comply in all material respects with the accounting standards specified under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013, read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014 and the relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 as applicable. The financial statements have been prepared on an accrual basis and under the historical cost convention.

The accounting policies adopted in the preparation of financial statements are consistent with those of previous year.

1.2 Use of Estimates:

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with Indian GAAP requires the management to make judgments, estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of revenue, expenses, assets and liabilities and the disclosure of contingent liabilities, at the end of the reporting period. Although these estimates are based on the management's best knowledge of current events and actions, uncertainty about these assumptions and estimates could result in the outcomes requiring a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets or liabilities in future periods.

1.3 Revenue Recognition

Revenue is recognized to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the company and the revenue can be reliably measured. The following specific recognition criteria are met before revenue is recognized:

a) Interest

Interest income is recognized on a time proportion basis taking into account the amount outstanding and the applicable interest rate. Interest income is included under the head "Revenue from Operations" in the statement of profit and loss.

b) Dividend

Dividend income is recognized when the company's right to receive dividend is established by the reporting date.

c) Other Income

Other items of revenue are recognized in accordance with the Accounting Standard (AS-9) "Revenue Recongnition".

1.4 Inventories

Inventories are valued at lower of cost or net realizable value. Net realizable value is the estimated selling prince in the ordinary course of business, less estimated costs of completion and estimated costs necessary to make the sale.

1.5 Investments:

Investments, which are readily realizable and intended to the held for not more than one year from the date on which such investments are made, are classified as current investments. All other investments are classified as long term investments.

Current investments are carried in the financial statements at lower of cost and fair value determined on an individual investment basis. Long Term Investments are carried at cost. However, provision for diminution in value is made to recognize a decline other than temporary in the value of the investments. In case of investments in mutual funds, the net asset value of units declared by the mutual funds is considered as the fair value.

In accordance with the Schedule III to the Companies Act, 2013, the portion of the Long Term Investments classified above, and expected to be realised within 12 months of the reporting date, have been classified as current investments.

On disposal of an investment, the difference between its carrying amount and net disposal proceeds is charged or credited to the statement of profit and loss.

1.6 Earnings Per Share

Basic earnings per share are calculated by dividing the net profit or loss for the period attributable to equity shareholders (after deducting preference dividends and attributable taxes) by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the period. Partly paid equity shares are treated as fraction of an equity share to the extent that they are entitled to participate in dividends relative to a fully paid equity share during the reporting period. The Weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the period is adjusted for events such as bonus issue, bonus element in a rights issue, share spilit, and reverse share split (consolidation of shares) that have changed the number of equity shares outstanding, without a corresponding change in resources.

For the purpose of calculating diluted earnings per share, the net profit or loss for the period attributable to equity shareholders and the weighted average number of shares outstanding during the period are adjusted for the effects of all dilutive potential equity shares.

1.7 Income Taxes

Current Taxes

Provision for current income-tax is recognized in accordance with the provisions of Indian Income- tax Act, 1961 and is made annually based on the tax liability after taking credit for tax allowances and exemptions.

Deferred Taxes

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are recognized for the future tax consequences attributable to timing differences that result between the profits offered for income taxes and the profits as per the financial statements. Deferred tax assets and liabilities are measured using the tax rates and the tax laws that have been enacted or substantially enacted at the balance sheet date. Deferred tax Assets are recognized only to the extent there is reasonable certainty that the assets can be realized in the future. Deferred Tax Assets are reviewed as at each Balance Sheet date.

1.8 Contingent Liabilities

A contingent liability is a possible obligation that arise from past events whose existence will be confirmed by the occurence or non occurrence of one or more uncertain future events beyond the control of the company or a present obligation that is not recognized because it is not probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation. A contingent liability also arises in extremely rare cases where there is a liability that cannot be recognized because it cannot be measured reliably. The company does not recognize a contingent liability but discloses its existence in the financial statements.

1.9 Provisions

A provision is recognized when the company has a present obligation as a result of past event, it is probable that an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation. Provisions are not discounted to their present value and are determined based on the best estimate required to settle the obligation at the reporting date. These estimates are reviewed at each reporting date and adjusted to reflect the current best estimates.

Where the company expects some or all of a provision to be reimbursed, the reimbursement is recognized as a separate asset but only when the reimbursement is virtually certain. The expense relating to any provision is presented in the statement of profit and loss net of any reimbursement.

1.10 Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and Cash Equivalents for the purposes of cash flow statement comprise cash at bank, cash in hand and short term investments with an original maturity of three months or less.

1.11 Miscelleneous Expenditure :

Preliminary expenditure is written off in the year in which it is incurred, in accordance with provision of Accounting Standard – 26 "Intangible Assets".
